

Safe Work Procedure

BBQ

DO NOT use BBQ unless you have been instructed
in its safe use and operation and have been given permission

General Hazards and Safety Instructions during Use

Risk of Fire and Explosion!

Safe use of BBQ:

Outdoor Use Only. Never Leave Unattended.

- Never leave BBQ's while in operation.
- Near-by fire extinguisher/fire blanket
- Check gas cylinder hoses and valves for damage before use. If parts are damaged, defective or missing, do not use.
- Ensure date stamped on gas bottle is no greater than 10 years old.
- Ensure gas cylinder is correctly connected to hose fittings prior to use.
- Where possible, keep gas cylinder up wind, when in use and away from combustible materials and vegetation.
- Do not allow oil or grease to come into contact with the gas cylinder, valves or hoses.
- Do not store or use flammable materials/liquids in the vicinity of the BBQ.
- Ensure BBQ gas valve and gas cylinder are turned off when finished cooking.
- Clean drip trays before using the BBQ.



Warning. If you smell gas:

- Shut off gas to appliance and extinguish any open flame.
- Check for any gas leaks in the hose or connections to the regulator and the regulator connection to the gas bottle.
- If odour continues, seek professional advice.

Leaking gas may cause fire or explosion, which can cause serious injury or death or damage to property.

Other Safety Instructions

Storage and handling of Cylinders

- Gas cylinders are to be stored outside in ventilated secured area where they cannot be accidentally knocked over.
- Don't store cylinders upside down – the liquid interferes with the gaskets.
